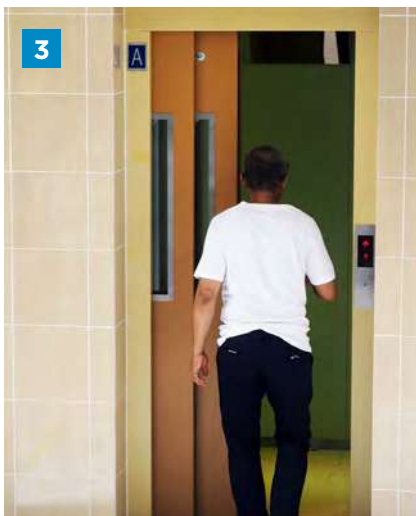


# Better Amenities, Brighter Communities

## Up Close

### With **Mr Lim Biow Chuan**

He is the MP for Mountbatten SMC, Chairman of Marine Parade Town Council, Deputy Speaker of Parliament, President of the Consumers Association of Singapore (CASE) and member of Singapore's Data Protection Advisory Committee. The man with many hats, took time out of his busy schedule to have a chat with us. In this issue, we find out what spurs him to continuously serve the residents and the nation, and what are his plans for Marine Parade Town.

**You were elected as MP since the 2006 General Elections – it has been 12 years! What motivates you to keep going, and continuously serving the community for so many years?**

There are many ways in which an MP can positively impact the lives of others. Over the past 12 years, I had worked with my team of volunteers to speak to policy makers and to government agencies to persuade them to see things from the resident's perspective. We had also introduced several programmes to help build community bonds and to assist the lower income. Residents who have witnessed the work that we do, have stepped forward to acknowledge our work. That is a great source of encouragement.

I have also been blessed by a fantastic team of community leaders, volunteers and staff who have shown great professionalism and dedication to their work. Thus, I will be motivated as long as I can do my part to help build a better Singapore for the future.

**You have taken on many roles in the community as well as being the Deputy Speaker of Parliament, how do you make time for your family?**

I think the first thing is to recognise that family is always important. I am not just a husband to my wife, but also a father to my children and a son to my mother (father passed away 9 years ago). As a discipline, I always plan to set aside time for them. If I don't ensure that the family is a top priority, there is always the risk that they may take 2nd or even 3rd place because of the demands of work on your time.

I believe that it is not enough to spend quality time with the family. It is also important to spend quantity time with them. Hence, I ensure that I have regular meals with the family, bring them out for holidays and to have general bonding time with them. The family must know that you will always be available for them whenever they need.





**Could you share with us a meaningful conversation or experience you've had with your residents, that had left a deep impact in your career?**

There has been many occasions when residents come up to me and thanked me for my services as an MP. Each time this happens, I will acknowledge the efforts and contributions of the many other volunteers who have sacrificed their time to work as a team to improve the lives of the residents. All these are reminders that each of us have a role to play in the community. If we can see things in a positive manner, there are so many ways in which we can improve the lives of our friends and neighbours.

**Do you have a motto that you live by?**

Life is what you make out of it; so make the best of your life. Be positive and strive to be a blessing to others.

**What is your vision for the Mountbatten estate as the MP, and for Marine Parade Town as the Chairman of Marine Parade Town Council?**

Next year marks the 60th year since Mountbatten was carved into a constituency. My objective is to continue to ensure that Mountbatten Constituency is well maintained and constantly refreshed in terms of amenities. I also have a hope that the people of Mountbatten would be people who are kind, helpful and gracious to their fellow residents. In this way, we will have a constituency that all of us would call home.

For the Marine Parade Town, we have taken great efforts to rejuvenate the estate. As many parts of Marine Parade Town are quite old, we need to ensure that the amenities and facilities are able to meet the needs of a greying population. The Town Council has also identified green initiatives to promote environmental sustainability, as covered in this issue. Some of these efforts also reflect the valuable input we have received from residents and stakeholders through our house visits and grassroots meetings, and for this I am truly thankful. What we do today certainly has impact for our future and every effort, however small, will go a long way.

The Mountbatten estate has seen many improvements over the years. Most of the works were implemented with feedback gathered on the ground and raised during MP walks and community meetings. Mr Lim Biow Chuan has also suggested and pushed for certain upgrading works specifically targeting the residents' convenience and concerns.

On 14 October 2018, residents had a *wheelie* good time at the Safe Cycling Carnival held at Blk 50A Marine Terrace. The event organised by Marine Parade Neighbourhood Police Centre (NPC), Bedok South NPC and Marine Parade CC, featured a series of activities to educate residents on the importance of safe cycling. This included a skit from Haig Girls' School and a Safe Riding Programme which allowed residents to test their knowledge and skills on safe riding on an interactive circuit.

Guest-of-Honour, Emeritus Senior Minister Goh Chok Tong, joined in on this eventful day and interacted with the residents.

During this event, the Community Policing Officers also shared with residents on their Coastal Watch Group and how residents could sign up to be part of the watch. Public outreach efforts from several agencies and community partners were also thriving, as booths were set up to educate residents on various community messages.

## MacPherson's 50th Anniversary Finale

Even though MacPherson turned 50, it gave residents an out-of-this-world, futuristic experience to celebrate the end of the year-long celebrations.

The young and young-at-heart celebrated the finale of the MacPherson's 50th Anniversary on 17 November 2018 at the hard court opposite MacPherson CC. Themed, "Looking into the Future", the carnival featured many activities and items focusing on digital advancements, such as Virtual Reality (VR) games, racing stimulators, and even a roving robot that was handing out free drinks! Some residents were introduced to the NETSPay app, and they could use their newly downloaded app to make actual payments at the food booths located at the carnival.

The highlight of the night was when Host MP, Ms Tin Pei Ling and Guest-of-Honour, Deputy Prime Minister Mr Teo Chee Hean launched the new MacPherson Cares app. This app helps to link senior citizens in MacPherson with volunteers or 'befrienders' in the estate, to visit or help them out. With this, MacPherson is moving towards making its precinct a smart estate.







# Keeping Clean & Going Green

Here in Marine Parade Town, we're BIG on keeping our estates clean and building a sustainable Town for the betterment of our residents. This year, with the help and support of the various Residents' Committees across the precincts, we brought the residents together to engage in clean and green activities for both the 'Keep Clean, Singapore' events initiated by the Public Hygiene Council held in June, and the 'Clean and Green Week' held in November 2018.

On top of the usual litter picking exercises, we placed an emphasis on green initiatives by introducing recycling of e-waste, and engaged in public education to help residents understand the importance of keeping their neighbourhood clean and seek to instil a sense of ownership in the cleanliness of the estate.

Not forgetting that the living environment of the estates are also made better by the daily efforts of our cleaners, the unsung heroes were also appreciated for their hard work through these events.







# *Energy-Saving Efforts in Our Town*



Climate change is a constant challenge faced in this technologically-advanced world today. We are reminded that energy is a finite resource, and here in Marine Parade Town, we aim to conserve these resources and build a greener and more sustainable environment.

In our bid to reduce carbon emissions, 508 residential blocks consisting of 98,747 fittings and lamp posts were replaced or retrofitted with Light-emitting diode (LED) fittings/bulbs installation as at FY 2017/2018, and these are only the first two batches of installations. These lightings not only consume lesser power for the same

amount of brightness as non-LED bulbs, the lightings also have a longer lifespan.

To reduce the reliance on fossil fuels and in turn, reduce the emissions of greenhouse gases, the Town Council has installed Solar Photovoltaic Systems at 117 blocks in the estates. These systems harvest renewable energy from sunlight and converts them into solar power. The solar energy generated is used to power the lifts, lightings in the common areas, and water pumps. It is estimated that the utilization of solar energy can conserve up to approximately 30 per cent of the total electricity consumption for one block.



In the upcoming years, the Town Council will be installing the third batch of LED fittings/bulbs in common areas, and there are also plans to install more solar PV panels in our Town.





The biennial Community in Bloom Awards recognise and reward gardening efforts of our local gardening groups.

The awards aim to motivate and encourage community gardeners to improve the standards of their gardens, and to continue to enjoy gardening as a fun and healthy activity. Through such efforts, the awards hope to promote a love for gardening to others in the community.

## Increasing Public Awareness Through Collaborative Efforts

In a combined effort to tackle the issues against pigeon feeding, Marine Parade Town Council along with seven other Town Councils (Ang Mo Kio Town Council, Bishan-Toa Payoh Town Council, Chua Chu Kang Town Council, Jalan Besar Town Council, Nee Soon Town Council, Pasir Ris-Punggol Town Council and Sembawang Town Council) and NEA, were involved in a pilot project initiated by AVA, to place "No Pigeon Feeding" standees at affected areas.

In recognising the collaborative efforts in educating the public, the parties involved received an Award under the Team Category at the Municipal Services Award by the Municipal Services Office (MSO) on 12 September 2018, for helping to raise public awareness against pigeon feeding.

This award recognises good citizen-centric delivery of municipal service and inter-agency efforts to achieve effective solutions.

### How do I know if I need to switch to Digital TV?

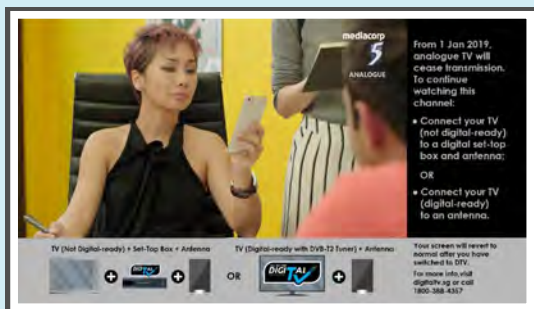
If your TV is subscribed to Singtel's or StarHub's Pay TV service, you are already watching Digital TV.

Otherwise, if you see a reduced picture on your TV screen, you are receiving analogue TV signals and will need to switch. Check what equipment you need to get at <https://digitaltv.sg/#search>.

You can buy DTV equipment at all major electronic retail outlets. Singaporeans who stay in HDB flats and do not have Pay TV can redeem free equipment with the DTV Starter Kit.

If you qualify but haven't received a letter from IMDA (Infocomm Media Development Authority), you can apply at <https://starterkit.digitaltv.sg/#apply> or obtain an application form from CCs or HDB branch offices. If you've received your letter, you can redeem your DTV Starter Kit at any participating retail store\* with your letter or NRIC.

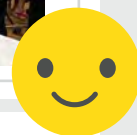

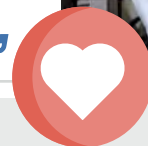
